**KIA CHAMP INTO THE ARENA  
Five-a-side Championship**

**TOURNAMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS**

**1. Number of Players and eligibility**

- Squads are to be made up of 6 players one of whom is the goalkeeper. Only five players, one of whom is the goalkeeper are allowed on the pitch at any one time.
- All players must be male, over 18 on or before May 7, 2011.
- Professional footballers or former professional players are not permitted.

**2. Time keeping**

- Tournament draw and game times will be announced at BAA Field at 11 a.m. on May 14th.
- Teams must be ready to play on the designated pitch 5 minutes before the allocated kickoff time. Failure to do so will result in expulsion from the competition.

**3. The Duration of the Match**

Each match lasts two equal periods of 15 minutes. Tied matches will be decided by penalties.

**4. Substitutions**

- The number of substitutions made during a match is unlimited.
- The maximum number of substitutions permitted is 1 per time.
- A player who has been replaced may return to the pitch as a substitute for another player of the same team
- A substitution is only allowed to take place when the ball is out of play

**5. Playing Equipment**

- A player must not use equipment or wear anything that is dangerous to himself or another player, including any kind of jewelry.
- Each player must wear a Top, shorts, socks, shin guards and appropriate footwear.
- Team members, with the exception of the goalkeeper, must wear the same colour shirt and wear alternate coloured shirts to the opposition.

**6. The Referee**

- Each match is controlled by a referee who has full authority to enforce the Laws of the Game in connection with the match to which he has been appointed, from the moment he enters the locality where the pitch is situated until he leaves.
- The decisions of the referee regarding facts connected with play are final.

**7. The Start and Restart of Play**

- The choice of ends is decided by the toss of a coin. The team winning the toss decides which goal it wishes to attack in the first half of the match and the other team takes the kick-off to start the match
- In the second half of the match the teams change ends and attack the opposite goals.

**8. The Ball in and Out of Play**

- The ball is out of play when:
  - It has wholly crossed the goal line or touchline, whether on the ground or in the air.
  - Play has been stopped by the referee
- The ball is in play at all other times including when it rebounds from a goal post or the crossbar onto the field of play.

**9. Free kicks**

- A direct free kick is conceded at the point of infringement (or moved so as to be at least 4 yards from the side, and 2 yards outside the goal area) for:
  - intentional body contact
  - charging, pushing, kicking, tripping
  - slide tackling
  - handball, except by the goal keeper in his area
  - handball by the goal-keeper outside the area
- An indirect free kick is conceded for:
  - Obstruction, including holding the wall
  - Time wasting, including holding the ball in a corner; withholding, throwing or kicking the ball away at a dead ball situation; not retreating 2 yards at a conceded free kick
  - Dissent, including persistent bad language and intimidation
- If a direct free kick is kicked directly into the opponent's goal, a goal is awarded
- A goal can be scored from an indirect free kick only

if the ball subsequently touches another player before it enters the goal

- All opponents must be at least 5 meters from the ball until it is in play the ball is in play after it has been touched or played.

#### 10. Penalties

- A penalty kick is awarded against a team that commits any of the offences for which a direct free kick is awarded, inside its own penalty area and while the ball is in play
- No players except the goalkeeper should be in front of the ball, or within the Goalkeepers area indicated
- When facing a penalty the goalkeeper must stand on the goal-line and must not move until kick has been taken. If an infringement results in a saved penalty the kick shall be re-taken
- The penalty taker may only take a 2 step run up and must not dummy the goal keeper. If an infringement results in a scored penalty the kick shall be re-taken.

#### 11. Kick-Ins

- A kick-in is used to restart play after the ball has gone out of play. No throw-ins are allowed.
- A goal cannot be scored directly from a kick-in.

#### 12. Goal Clearances

- A goal clearance is a method of restarting play
- A goal may not be scored directly from a goal clearance

#### 13. Corner Kicks

A goal may be scored directly from a corner kick, but only against the opposing team.

#### 14. Penalty shootouts

- Penalty kicks shall be used to determine the winning

team after a match has been drawn.

- Teams will toss a coin to decide which team will shoot first. Subsequent penalties will be taken alternately by both teams.
- Each team member on the field of play at the end of the match shall take one penalty in turn.
- If the scores are still level after all penalties have been taken, the match will be decided by "sudden death". Each team will take an equal number of penalties until one team fails to score.

#### 15. Special Rules for Goalkeepers and Goal Areas

- The goalkeeper must not be in possession of the ball for more than 10 seconds; infringement results in a direct free kick 2 meters outside the area
- The goalkeeper must not directly receive the ball from the same defender as he has released it to

#### 16. Drop Balls

The referee may use a drop-ball to restart the game if no side is responsible for the stoppage.

#### 17. Advantage

If the referee considers that stopping the game to award a free kick will disadvantage the side being offered the free kick he can allow play to continue

#### 18. Bookings and sendings off

- A player booked twice will be suspended from the match
- Bookable offences include dissent, ungentlemanly conduct, time wasting and aggressive behavior
- Sending off offences include persistent dissent, violent conduct, a second bookable offence following previous booking (i.e. persistent infringement of the rules)

## BAA FIELD RULES

### BAA synthetic field rules and regulations that must be followed:

1. No food or drinks (except water) on the turf field.
2. No glass bottles or containers allowed on the turf field.
3. No chewing gum, candy or sunflower feeds permitted on the turf field.
4. No dogs or other animals permitted on the turf field.
5. No skateboards, roller blades, bicycles, strollers or motorized vehicles permitted on the turf field.
6. Golfing is not permitted on turf field.
7. No open flames or fireworks permitted on turf field.
8. No smoking near or inside field fencing or inside any areas of the BAA sports complex.
9. No throwing of discus, javelin or shot put on turf field.
10. No metal/removable Cleats permitted on turf field. Rubber/plastic-molded Cleats only on turf field.
11. Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on turf field.
12. No stakes, posts, poles or markers of any kind may be driven into the turf field.
